

Muhammad Yunus, Nobel Peace Prize Winner and Founder of the Grameen Bank, engages with students from EDHEC

Roundtable conference held during proceedings of the G20 YES (Young Entrepreneurs Summit)

Some 400 entrepreneurs from the G20 countries met at EDHEC's Nice campus on the occasion of the G20 International Entrepreneurs Summit, also known as the G20 Young Entrepreneurs Summit (or G20 YES), held October 31st through November 2nd, 2011.
